The position has responsibility for ensuring the health and well-being of program koalas, including conducting comprehensive veterinary examinations of koalas under anaesthesia, collecting samples for diagnostic and research purposes, and treating sick or injured animals. Performing necropsy examinations to accurately determine the causes of mortality in the population and fitting telemetry devices to koalas are components of the role.
