

# **EXOTIC Contagious bovine pleuropneumonia**

## **Fact sheet**

#### **Introductory statement**

Contagious bovine pleuropneumonia is **not present** in Australia. It is a contagious bacterial disease that affects the lungs of cattle, buffalo, zebu and yaks. Sheep, goats, camels, antelope and wild bovids are resistant to the disease. Humans are also unaffected.

The bacterium is widespread in Africa, the Middle East, southern Europe and parts of Asia. It is an airborne bacterium and can travel up to several kilometres under certain conditions.
